Our updated Student Directory is now online. It is a new format and is searchable by first or last name, but the search criteria also applies to email addresses; for example (albeit a silly one), if you search by Sammamish, two records actually display because of email addresses that include that exact string of characters. Play around with it -- you basically have to enter enough characters to narrow the search to a number of records that is "manageable" for the system to display on the screen -- and we honestly have no idea what that threshold is!

We have made a couple "behind the scenes" changes so that the website is more aligned with Wolf Tracks (and FB) as a communication tool. (More about this in next month's meeting, time permitting.) Basically, Deanna is now included on the Communications email alias to put the website in the loop -which means you no longer have to email both "communications" and "website" separately if you want something announced in both. Also, the format of Wolf Tracks has been trimmed down and will include the most pertinent information and, if needed, a link to the website for more details. This keeps WT more concise and can drive traffic to the website, which is why we are working to make sure it includes what people need and provide a good user experience. This doesn't mean that everything in WT will be on the website, and vice versa, but let your communications team handle all of that. :-) So just to clarify: Deanna and Patti are on the website alias, and Bobbie (WT), Julie (FB) and Deanna are on the communications alias.
