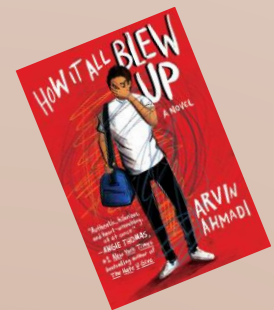


The Central Intelligence Agency and other spy organizations would not exist in America if not for this woman, Virginia Hall. She could have stayed behind a desk in the USA but
